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FAITH FORMATION 2024-2025 GENERAL INFORMATION REGISTRATION

Each family must be a registered member of the Parish. Parish registration forms can be downloaded from the Parish website (www.stpiusxsy.com), picked up at the Rectory weekdays, or the Faith Formation office.

A Baptismal certificate must be on file in the Faith Formation Office for each child who was <u>not</u> baptized at St Pius X.

It is necessary to re-register for Faith Formation each year. Each family must fill out one Family Card (white), and a Blackboard form (purple) List <u>all</u> the children on the white card (even if they attend Catholic School). If there is more than one last name in the family, please make clear what the legal name of each child is. Be sure to include home and cell phone numbers, email addresses and indicate which the best way to reach you. <u>Emergency contact information is only used if we cannot contact a parent first.</u> Please print carefully, please provide a non-parent contact if possible.

Fees:

\$50.00 per child, \$70.00 for two children, for three or more children \$90.00 per family. Payments may be deferred or made in installments, but please do not delay registration. Scholarships are available, call for more information.

There will be an additional \$25.00 fee for Second Grade and Ninth Grade students due to the expenses of the Retreats.

KINDERGARTEN

Will be held on Sundays beginning Sunday, September 22nd. Class time is 9:00-10:10 AM.

GRADES 1-5

For all children in grades 1-5 class time is <u>Sunday Morning from 9:00-10:10AM</u>. Regular classes for grades 1-5 will begin on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 22nd</u> Classes will end at **10:10 A.M**. Parents should meet their children upstairs, in the Parish Hall. Families are encouraged to attend the 10:30AM Family Mass. If it is necessary to drop your child off early for class please <u>accompany them into the building</u> as there is not always someone there to attend to them.

GRADE 2 REMINDER:

Children, who have completed the first year of sacramental preparation, are required to recite the Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be to the Father, and Act of Contrition before First Reconciliation and Communion. Call or email the Faith Formation Office for an appointment.

DELAYED SACRAMENTS

Many children beyond Grade 2 have not celebrated the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and/or First Communion. We do provide special classes for these children. Please contact the Faith Formation Office for more information.

GRADES 6, 7, and 8:

Classes begin Monday, September 23rd, from 6:00 - 7:30 P.M. Students in grades 6, 7 and 8, will bring home their books. Each week they should come to class prepared and with their books. The books should be treated carefully so they last throughout the year. Replacement fee is \$20.00

DISMISSAL:

Parents, please pick up your child promptly at the end of their session. If a child must be dismissed early from class, they should bring a note for the teacher. **The parent is asked to come into the building and sign them out with the receptionist.** Children will not be allowed to wait outside while classes are in session. If you have a problem and expect to be late, please call so we can explain to your child and have them wait inside with one of us.

GRADE 9 (Confirmation Candidates)

Sunday evening Mass/Class will include the 5:00 Mass and continue to 7:30 P.M. in the Faith Formation Center. Please note very carefully the schedule of those classes as there are only 13 classes, **no more than 2 absences will be allowed**. Mass is an integral part of the session. We hope that families would attend Mass and sit with their child in the section we have reserved. **The first class is Sunday, September 29**th.

THE DRESS CODE.

How students dress affects attitude and behavior. We have adopted a similar dress code for Faith Formation as the Dennis Yarmouth School System. Cleats, and slippers are not to be worn to Faith Formation. Any clothing or jewelry that is offensive, obscene or inappropriate, that includes short shorts, tank or tube tops, exposed midriffs or pants that hang down and expose underwear, as well as "pajamas" may not be worn to Faith Formation. No one may wear hats or "hoodies" Clothing with reference to cigarettes, alcohol, or inappropriate language is not allowed

GENERAL NOTES:

Mass is a large part of Christian formation. Our teaching is based on the expectation that each child attends Mass and is encouraged in participation and understanding by their family. As the mystery of the Mass unfolds the child's faith formation deepens. The children should be experiencing an ongoing, lifelong conversion, a deepening of faith.

Faith Formation is a limited process. We meet with each child for approximately 24 hours during a school year. Since it is such a short amount of time, each class is important and each child is expected to attend all classes. Students are deprived of learning great lessons about our faith when they are absent.

Regular attendance is expected. If you know in advance that your child will miss a class, please let us know and complete the lesson at home. In case of emergency or illness the child will be expected to complete the make-up work upon returning.

The parents of any student who has missed more than 3 classes and/or has not completed the work must meet with the Director of Faith Formation before the child's return to class.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES:

Please take special care in filling out the section under <u>Special Considerations/Medical or Educational</u> on the Family Card. While we do not have special need's teachers, we are willing to accommodate a child's special need. Our volunteers try to be sensitive to each child's needs. If your child has reading problems, we suggest you take time to go over the lessons at home. It would be helpful if we knew that a child is on medication, or an IEP, or any other special circumstance, so that we can plan accordingly. In some cases we can arrange for an extra person to be with your child. However, we do have a reasonable expectation for appropriate behavior. We would like to make each situation easier. Please call the office if you would like to discuss or explain anything that will make your child more comfortable while they are here and let us know if there are any changes throughout the year.

BEHAVIOR:

Christian behavior is expected from everyone. All participants in St. Pius X Faith Formation have the responsibility to conduct themselves with respect for others. In the event that there is a problem and classroom rules are not followed we will ask parents to work with us to resolve the problem. If resolution is not possible and the student continues to be disruptive they will be sent home and we will schedule a conference with the student, parent and catechist to create a plan for success.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

For general announcements we use Blackboard Connect messaging system. On the "Blackboard Connect Form" (purple) List the emergency phone number(s) and email(s) where you wish to receive general information and emergency messages. Please write carefully.

VOLUNTEERS:

Faith Formation is only possible with the support of more than 50 volunteers. If your child is part of the program, we hope that you could help in some way. We need teachers, aides, receptionists, office help, as well as help with special projects throughout the year. Please consider how you can help.
